My recent visit to Ottawa served as a reminder to me of that great experience, two summers ago, when I enjoyed the privilege of working for you. Further, upon discovering that you have not settled upon a successor for Keith, it helped me decide to request your consideration of a more formal "return engagement" on my part.

Fully anticipating that you have, or will have, received applications from a number of very qualified persons, I do not request any special consideration. At the same time, I wish to claim some insight into the demands of the position, and feel that past experience in working for you and writing for The Spectator provide the basis for an eager acceptance of the challenge.
