

ave you hugged a bureaucrat today? You say that you prefer to bash bureaucrats rather than hug them? Well, you're certainly not alone! Canadians don't seem to have high regard for civil servants, many of whom are perceived as neither civil nor serviceoriented. But is this perception an accurate one? The answer is no! The widespread negative view of civil servants is based largely on ignorance of their roles and responsibilities.

A major theme in my recent book on The Responsible Public Servant (co-authored with Professor John Langford of the U. of Victoria), is that being a responsible civil servant is a very difficult task indeed. Civil servants are often subjected to conflicting demands-from political superiors, legislators, pressure groups, journalists, and ordinary citizens. They have traditionally been advised that

It is of course naive to berate politicians for their overriding interest in winning elections, but is it really necessary for them to ride to victory on the backs of bureaucrats? Surely this is not only unnecessary behaviour, but unworthy behaviour!

Fortunately, public enthusiasm for bureaucrat bashing seems to be diminishing. For example, recent opinion surveys indicate that the public's image of the civil service is gradually improving. One day, Canadians may have to find a new national pastime. It's about time!


Achiever's Image Breeds a Child's Success


find in life are not so much a factor of what we are, but more importantly what we think we are not. Think about that for a minute...it is not what we are that holds us back, it is what we think we are not!

So as parents we must ask questions. "How can I ensure that my child will be successful?" "How can I ensure that my child will see the world as a place full of possibilities and challenges waiting to be conquered?" "How can I ensure that my child will see herself in a positive light?"

To draw upon a parallel incident from the animal world might serve as an example to help clarify this point. Circus trainers are often forced to deal with both mature and young elephants simultaneously. On one such occasion, a young boy was walking by and noticed that tied to a telephone pole were two elephants, a full grown female and a baby elephant approximately four months of age.

The boy noticed that the mother elephant was secured by only a small rope while tied to the same pole, heavy leg irons and a substantial chain held the baby elephant. The boy noticed, too, that the mother was typically quite passive. The baby was pulling on the chain, all the time trying to free itself from its restrictions.

The boy asked the trainer why the elephants were secured in the manner in which they were. The trainer answered that the mother

So to address the question of insurance on the part of parents...what can be said? Success breeds success...an old adage, yes, but so true none the less. Our inner drive to pursue new challenges, to address the future with a positive and optimistic set of expectations, is directly related to the success that we have previously experienced in similar situations. If we provide experiences for our children that are development-ally appropriate and within their ability range, the opportunity for them to experience success dramatically increases. With the increase in success comes a personal sense that is reflected in the belief held by the child that "I am responsible and capable of dealing with what is expected of me." It is the responsibility of coaches, teachers and parents to provide opportunities for children to routinely experience situations in which success is probable. By orchestrating programs and learning experiences where this can occur, we go a long way to ensuring that our children will develop positive self-images and positive expectations about themselves.



Capital Campaign Ushers in the 90's or. The partners' recortation

661've been involved with many campaigns," savs Allan Orr. "but this is the first one I've enjoyed." The Chair of Brock's Board, together with Trustee Ken Fowler, led the recently completed drive to "Give Brock the Business," surpassing a \$3.5 million goal to realize \$4.8 million. In addition to completing the financing for the \$8.5 million Taro Building, the campaign has financed the Burgoyne Centre for Entrepreneurship and provided the legacy of a 50 per cent increase in the University's endowment.

What bricks and mortar do you get for \$8.5 million these days? The 42,000 square foot, three story Taro Building now under construction will house the Faculty of Business Studies and the Departments of **Economics and Politics. More** academic departments will benefit when existing space is vacated and renovated.

While the campaign took just 16 months from conception to the announcement of the final achievement, the Taro Building results from plans laid several years ago. The University was crowded. 'Intimate' was taking on a whole new meaning in the context of Brock's traditionally intimate classes. Indeed, Brock had just 77 per cent of the space that its enrollment justified. A new building was needed.

Under its funding formula, the provincial government would contribute two-thirds of the capital cost of approved projects. Brock stated its case and won approval in the late spring of 1988. The plan for the new building specified seminar rooms, case study rooms, research labs, faculty offices, plus lounge areas for both students and professors.

This exciting vision came with the stubborn reality of a \$3.5 million capital campaign. For Brock President Terry White, just arriving from the University of Alberta, it meant a quick initiation to the Ontario government and to a new University. "The campaign provided a

useful learning experience for me in that I had to learn a lot about the University very quickly."

"I thought that the President should play a leadership role. I worked closely with (Executive Director, External Relations) Grant Dobson, who developed the campaign strategy and served as Campaign Director," recalls President White. "Mr. Dobson wanted the campaign to achieve a number of communication and development goals beyond the immediate monetary need. We wanted to run a successful campaign and leave in place a dedicated group of volunteers. We wanted a development plan that would boost annual

fundraising. We surpassed these objectives and the icing on the cake is a \$1.1 million increase in our endowment to do the things that are not possible through our operating budget."

Both President White and Grant Dobson were confident the \$3.5 million target could be reached with careful planning and committed volunteer leadership. The committed leadership was provided by Messrs. Orr and Fowler who recruited the balance of the campaign organization. "I can't say enough about them," says President White. "Their enthusiasm and dedication were infectious. The volunteers captured that enthusiasm."

Mr. Orr says his most important role was bringing Ken Fowler on board. "He is very respected in the Niagara area. I saw myself as leading in the heavy industry area which I came from, and Ken working with the new players."

Both worked with Grant

Dobson and President White to set up a campaign organization. "We spent a lot of time laving out the organization," Mr. Fowler said. "It had to be good or we risked losing the good people we wanted to recruit. We had the right need at the right time. Brock was showing a renewed commitment to the community with programs like the Burgovne Centre for Entrepreneurship. Many of the best people in Niagara and beyond were happy to join us.'

The plan was to solicit the fewest and largest donations possible. Soon the campaign team was assembled and a new donor relations policy made their job easier as it provided systematized recognition for donations. The donor relations policy gave donors the opportunity to participate in the project of their choice.

Chancellor Robert Welch took on the task of media relations and the campaign was divided into four sections: Foundations, Niagara (St. Catharines, Niagara Falls and Welland), National Corporations and Brock Faculty and Staff.

President White undertook many speaking engagements with community groups and at 25th Anniversary luncheons held throughout Niagara. "The ingredients were right," according to Terry White.

The whole region became involved and there was strong momentum. I've found there's an enormous base of talent here and many of these people got behind the campaign enthusiastically. I now have a better appreciation of Niagara—it's a real go-getter type of community."

The campaign was also designed to develop the University's national base and make the corporate sector aware of the uniqueness of Brock. Recalls Terry White, "In stating a case before the corporate sector, \$1 million, the largest gift

The word was out. Brock was embarking on a campaign, and an early major donation let the community know this campaign meant business — or "Give Brock the Business" as the signature for the campaign read.

Soon came the donation that set the pace and gave the campaign its momentum. On New Years' Eve of 1989, Ken Fowler and his Taro Properties Inc. partners Desmond Vaughan, Kerry Howe and Roy Cairns would donate

ever made to Brock University. Under the University's donor relations policy and campaign designation opportunities, the new structure was renamed the Taro Building. The partners' reputation served to attract many new donors, their visions raised by the magnitude of the lead

The \$1 million instilled confidence in the volunteers and soon another major donation was announced. This time, \$500,000 from the Burgoyne family who own the St. Catharines Standard. Their donation — marking the paper's 1991 Centennial - was allocated to fund The Burgoyne Centre for Entrepreneurship, Shortly after, faculty and staff led by Uwe Brand, Wendy Hollinshead, Bill LaHorey, Howard Prout and Jim Lennard netted \$273,457 for the 25th Anniversary Scholarship campaign which included the building campaign. Donors continued to respond generously and in October, the final achievement of \$4,817,555 was announced.

The University is in the enviable position of deciding how to allocate extra funds. Of the extra, \$400,000 was designated by donors for eight endowed projects including named scholarships and a lecture series. The balance of \$700,000. pledged over the next number of years, will be added to the University endowment as the Brock University Advancement Fund.

For President White, the successful campaign is a welcome achievement in his first years at Brock. As he puts it, 'We played in the big leagues and we won."







Thomson Wins 3M Teaching **Award**

t was Clarke Thomson's turn to make the grade. The affable geography professor was selected from 36,000 university teachers for one of 10 3M Teaching Fellowships. This marks the first time a Brock professor has won the 3M award since it was offered in 1986.

"I'm flabbergasted," said Prof. Thomson, 62, upon hearing of the award, "It's an incredible honour." The award is given by 3M Canada Inc. and the Society for Teaching and Learning in Higher Education to recognize excellence in teaching of a professor's own courses and leadership and commitment to excellence in university teaching. Prof. Thomson was instrumental in beginning a committee on campus geared toward improving professors' teaching abilities. He is also the 1989 recipient of the Excellence in Teaching Award presented by the Brock University Alumni Association.


Prof. Thomson was flown to the Chateau Montebello by 3 M Canada Inc.

for an exclusive three-day retreat and given a citation of teaching excellence. This is his 23rd year at Brock.

Rocky Named Best Canadian

e did it the Rocky way. Last October, Brock grad Rocky DiPietro, 33, set a Canadian Football League (CFL) record for the most passes caught in its history. In a game where his Hamilton Ti-Cats beat the Toronto Argonauts 45-14, DiPietro caught five Todd Dillion passes for a career total of 652—two more than Tommy Joe Coffey caught in 14 CFL seasons from 1959 to 1973.

Afterward, the 12-year veteran slotback told The Globe and Mail, "If I had it my way, this record thing would have stayed quiet," DiPietro said. "I'm not used to the limelight." No chance. He was subsequently named the Schenley outstanding Canadian in the league, and the Hamilton Ti-Cats went to the Grey Cup against the Saskatchewan Rough-



DiPietro's personal cheering section could be heard calling out "Rocky" over network television when he was announced in the Skydome. But his personal triumph was marred by a team defeat, and -some argued- uneven officiating. In what many are calling the most exciting game in Grey Cup history, the Cats lost 43-40 with Head Coach Al Bruno lambasting the

DiPietro holds two Brock degrees: BPhEd '82 and BEd '83, and makes his home in St. Catharines with wife, Patty (née Stamps), BPhEd '82, BRLS '83, BEd '84, and their son, Joseph. (Patty was recently named to Brock's 25th Anniversary All-Star Women's Basketball team). In the spring, Rocky DiPietro has his own homecoming of sorts when he's back on Brock's campus for the Ti-Cat training camp.


